#2 plastics (HDPE) – NO CAPS/LIDS

 Windshield Washer Containers (Acceptable if there is no skull symbol; if there is skull symbol it goes to Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)).

#4, #5, & #6 plastics

Yogurt containers, margarine tubs & lids, clean flower pots, trays & planters (coded #2 and #5)

Plastic Bags (e.g. grocery bag, clear bag, sandwich bags, plastic cling film, any plastic you can poke holes in, etc.)

Carbon, photographic, blueprint paper, cards (with foil, plastic, ribbon, or lamination)

Flower pots, trays, planters, black take-out containers, anything with food/oil left in it.

Fall waste must be in paper bags and weigh no more than 50 pounds.
