OVERNIGHT PARKING

A reminder that there is no overnight parking on Town roads between 11:00 PM and 5:00 AM from November 15th to March 15th each year.

HIGHLAND GLEN PARK

The Highland Glen Park (formerly known as Highland Glen Conservation Area) is 11 hectares of beautiful forested ravine land and a 600-metre beach along Lake Huron, located at 5046 Lakeshore Road. The Park includes a boat ramp and safe harbour allowing access to Lake Huron for boaters. A picnic pavilion makes this area a great place for a summer day trip.

Effective April 4th, 2023 the boat launch is re-opened and available for public use!

Daily and Seasonal passes will be enforced to utilize the Highland Glen boat ramp. They are available for purchase at the municipal office (via cash, cheque, or debit) or through our online booking platform (via credit card). We will be offering daily launch passes for \$15.00 or seasonal launch passes for \$200.00 (unlimited launches). Hang-tags can be



picked up at the Municipal Office and placed in the vehicle's front window for easy identification or a printout of the online booking receipt will be acceptable.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING





Ensure your items are to the road by 7:00 a.m.



Acceptable Items:

Cardboard: broken down, bundles and tied with string no bigger than 2' x 2' x 18"

Metal Cans

Glass Jars and Bottles

Paper Products: ad mail, copy paper, office paper, statements, bills, flyers, paper cores, junk mail, Kraft paper, magazines, phone books, catalogues, cereal boxes, coffee trays, writing paper, egg cartons, paper molds and newsprint

Plastic #1 (PETE) *NO PLASTIC BOTTLE CAPS: soft drink bottles, cooking oil bottles, clear egg cartons, water bottles, peanut butter jars, juice bottles, dish soap bottles and mouth wash bottles

Plastic #2 (HDPE) *NO PLASTIC CAPS: juice containers, milk jugs, laundry soap containers, shampoo bottles and windshield washer containers (if no skull symbol)

Plastic #4, 5 & 6: yogurt containers, margarine tubs, clean flower pots, trays and planters (coded #2 and #5)

Bulk Items: large appliances, small metal appliances, water tanks, bbq's (no propane tank), furniture, fridge, freezers and air conditioners that are purged and tagged, carpet rolled & tied less than 4 feet in length, box springs, mattresses and bed frames

Electronics are accepted at our e-waste drop off location at the Reeces Corners Public Works Yard (5819 Oil Heritage Road).

Building Materials (including toilets) can be brought to Transco Recycling (387 McGregor Sideroad), Curran Recycling (526 McGregor Side Road) or Sevcon Recycling (940 Plank Road). Some charges may apply.

Hazardous Waste can be brought to Clean Harbour Canada (4090 Telfer Road). Clean Harbours offers a variety of Household Hazardous Waste Days, call 519-864-1021 for more information.

YARD WASTE



Yard Waste consists of leaves, grass and garden plant material only.

No sticks or brush in paper bags.

Leaf waste must be in paper bags or a container (no lid) marked with an "X" on both sides.

Bags and containers cannot weigh more than 50 pounds.

Yard Waste pick up will be every Friday throughout the month of May and from October 16 until the end of November. Pick up areas now include the former Village of Wyoming, **Camlachie and areas North of Lakeshore Road**.

Transco Recycling will also accept yard waste year round from all Plympton-Wyoming residents at no charge with proof of residency.

Please have all items to the road by 7:00 a.m.

Grease and Wipes Reminder

Please properly dispose of grease and disinfecting wipes in the garbage and not the toilet. Flushing of wipes and grease "wreak havoc" on residential pipes! It's important to remember that any type of disposable wipe, including baby wipes and wipes that are labeled as flushable, must go into the garbage and not be flushed into the sewer system. Such items contribute to troublesome clogs because they do not break down the same way that toilet paper does. A clog can cause a residential system back-up resulting in localized flooding and property damage. More significant clogs at the wastewater treatment facility can damage infrastructure resulting in costly repairs and potential interruptions in essential service. Help keep our pipes and sewer systems clear by disposing of grease and wipes in the trash can and not the toilet.
