The reaccreditation process involved a comprehensive review of SLEP's programs, strategic plans, and operations, highlighting the organization's commitment to excellence in economic development. As Ontario's second internationally accredited economic development office, SLEP is well-positioned to attract investment, facilitate job creation, and foster economic opportunities for the region.

"Achieving reaccreditation is a testament to the dedication of our team, the strength of our collaborative partnerships, and the direction of our board," said Matthew Slotwinski, CEO of Sarnia-Lambton Economic Partnership.
